## Soil Preparation

The month of May seems like the transition between winter and summer, at least here in Alaska. The hours of sunshine increase, our bodies become anxious to be out of heavy coats, our minds race with ideas for outdoor activities, the carts in the stores contain seeds and bags of dirt – you might say we become alive again after our winter hibernation. For those who have been active with winter sports, their attention now turns to hiking, swimming, biking, and gardening. The true gardener already has the seeds planted and are feeding the seedlings that will be transplanted once the ground is ready. Is your spiritual ground ready? What is meant by that? Handt Hanson has written some words that may help explain:

Lord, let my heart be good soil, open to the seed of your word.

### Northwest District Annual Gathering 2018 in Lebanon, Oregon

The Gathering was held on April 20th and 21st. The District includes churches from Alaska, Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Montana and Canadian Provinces (British Columbia, Alberta, Saskatchewan and Ontario). There are 82 LCMC congregations in the Northwest District of which 54 are currently members who come to the Annual Gathering. The theme for this year was “Equipping the Saints”. Excerpts from the messages by the keynote speakers follows:

Pastor Joe Beal (Christ the Servant Lutheran, Lacey, WA) based his presentation on Kent Hunters book entitled “**Who Broke My Church? – 7 Proven Strategies for Renewal and Revival**”.

- Kingdom Drift (some churches treat all members equally even though “infants in Christ” may have no biblical basis for decision making) (key measure of success – number of members, average worship attendance).
- Kingdom Culture (key measure of success – Discipleship) (change posture of church from an institution to a movement) (built on relationships).
- Growth – A thriving congregation focused on discipleship

The church in Lacey has moved away from program focus to focusing on two things: Prayer and Bible Study.

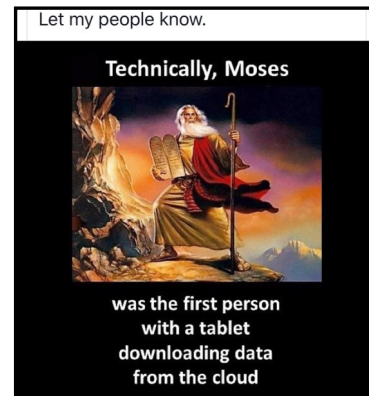
Pastor Perry Fruhling (LCMC Coordinator for Pastoral Ministry)
