

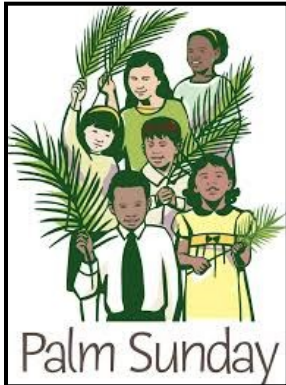

The Triumphal Entry (Sunday)

“Rejoice greatly, O Daughter of Zion! Shout, Daughter of Jerusalem! See, your king comes to you, righteous and having salvation, gentle and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey.” Zechariah 9:9

“The crowds... shouted, ‘Hosanna to the Son of David!’ ‘Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!’ ‘Hosanna in the highest!’” “This is Jesus, the prophet from Nazareth in Galilee.” Matthew 21: 9, 11

The Last Supper (Thursday)

The Resurrection (Sunday)

Then Peter began to speak: “We are witnesses of everything he did in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They killed him by hanging him on a cross, but God raised him from the dead on the third day and caused him to be seen. He was not seen by all the people, but by witnesses whom God had already chosen - by us who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead.”

GIFT of Eternal Life

At Christmas we celebrated the birth of our Savior, the long awaited Messiah, and these past months we have journeyed with Jesus and his disciples towards the final days in Jerusalem. The gift comes about by God’s grace to us through His son, Jesus Christ – the gift of righteousness, thus this “one righteous act resulted in justification and life for all people” (Rom. 5:18). Should there be any question in our mind that God loves us and that His great desire is to have us live eternally with him? By the grace of God we can worship and rejoice now and forever!
