EPHESIANS

During the next couple months, starting with July 15th and ending on September 2nd, the Second Lesson for each Sunday will come from the Book of Ephesians, one of Paul's letters written while he was imprisoned in Rome. Ephesus was the capital of a Roman province in an area which today is called Turkey and was strategically placed where major trade routes intersected. The city of Ephesus was included in Paul's missionary journeys.

Ephesians consists of 6 chapters which can be divided into 2 sections: Chapters 1-3 explain what God has done for our redemption and Chapters 4-6 give instructions how to respond and to live as God's children. As Harry Wendt explains in the "Crossways" series, 'This sequence is important, for it declares that the Christian life is a response to what God has already done for the salvation of humanity.'

The first chapter alone is filled with astounding truths about God's plan: 'blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing in Christ,' 'he chose us in him before the creation of the world', 'he predestined us to be adopted as his sons through Jesus Christ', and it continues on and on with God showering His love upon His people.

Beginning with chapter 4 the church is encouraged to be in unity with one another and to live as children of light, in other words, be imitators of God living a life of love. Before Paul's final greeting in chapter 6, he encourages the people to be "strong in the Lord" and then proceeds to explain the "armor of God" that will aid them in standing against the evil in the world.

An inspiring letter filled with encouragement and great truths!

Ephesians 2:8-9 "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God— not by works, so that no one can boast."

Ephesians 3:17b-19 "And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God."

Ephesians 4:4-6 "There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to one hope when you were called; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all."
